Semester or Academic Year at the University of Dar es Salaam



### DAR ES SALAAM

- Cosmopolitan port city on the Indian Ocean (population approximately 2.5 million)
- National language: Kiswahili
- Official languages: Kiswahili and English
- University located on Observation Hill, about 13 km west of the city center

- Late August 2007 to late May 2008  
Late August to late December 2007  
Early January to late May 2008

### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

- Pre-departure and on-site orientation
- Direct enrollment in UDSM courses
- Language of instruction: English
- One Kiswahili course/semester required
- Regular undergraduate course load (15 credits/semester)

### ELIGIBILITY

- Junior standing with 3.0 GPA, or higher
- One Africa-focused course, preferably L232 – Contemporary Africa
- Two semesters of Kiswahili (or its equivalent in summer intensive study)
- Demonstrate flexibility, resilience, and self-reliance

### HOUSING

- Double room in university dormitory

### ESTIMATED 2007-08 ACADEMIC YEAR COSTS

- Fee paid to IU: (tuition, bursar fees, health insurance, administrative fees)
  - Indiana Resident \$3,807/semester; \$6,879/academic year
  - Non-resident \$7,614/semester; \$13,758/academic year
- Housing and fees payable at UDSM: \$1,132-\$1,250
