C. Christine Fair is a senior political scientist with the RAND Corporation. Prior to rejoining RAND, she served as a political officer to the United Nations Assistance Mission to Afghanistan in Kabul and as a senior research associate in USIP's Center for Conflict Analysis and Prevention. Her research focuses upon the security competition between India and Pakistan, Pakistan's internal security, the causes of terrorism in South Asia, and U.S. strategic relations with India and Pakistan. She has authored and co-authored several books including *The Madrassah Challenge: Militancy and Religious Education in Pakistan* (USIP, 2008), *Treading Softly: Lessons Learned from Counter Insurgency Operations on Sacred Places*, co-edited with Sumit Ganguly (OUP, forthcoming 2008), *Fortifying Pakistan: The Role of U.S. Internal Security Assistance* (USIP, 2006), and has written numerous peer-reviewed articles covering a range of security issues in Pakistan, India, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh.
