**THE APA'S MINORITY FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM (MFP)** awards fellowships to top predoctoral and early career postdoctoral psychologists who have demonstrated a strong commitment to ethnic minority behavioral health services or policy.

## MFP BENEFITS

- Renewable financial support
- Travel support to the APA convention
- Potential dissertation support (limited availability)
- Ancillary training opportunities and enrichment experiences
- Access to information and resources
- Lifetime access to a network of professional psychologists focused on ethnic minority behavioral health issues

Applications are accepted each fall until **January 15th** of the year in which support is sought.

## MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES FELLOWSHIPS

**Predocctoral** – For students pursuing doctoral degrees in clinical, counseling, and school psychology or other behavioral health services areas.

**Postdoctoral** – For early career doctoral recipients who are interested in developing a career in behavioral health services or policy.

### Basic Eligibility

- U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Strong commitment to a career in ethnic minority behavioral health services or policy
- Enrolled full-time in an APA-accredited doctoral program for the fall term immediately following the application deadline (*for predoctoral applicants only*)
- A conferred doctoral degree in psychology in the last 5 years (*for postdoctoral applicants only*)

African Americans, Alaska Natives, American Indians, Asian Americans, Hispanics/Latinos, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders are especially encouraged to apply.
