

## Madeleine F. Green

Madeleine F. Green is an independent consultant and Senior Fellow at the International Association of Universities, a global higher education association (<http://www.iau-aiu.net>) dedicated to building community and strengthening higher education worldwide. She also serves as a Senior Fellow at NAFSA: The Association of International Educators. From 1991 to 2010 she was Vice President for International Initiatives at the American Council on Education (ACE). As vice president, she led ACE's internationalization efforts and its [Center for International Initiatives \(CII\)](#). Her work includes research and analysis on global higher education issues, advising institutions in the United States and abroad on strategic internationalization, and leading seminars and workshops on internationalization and global higher education issues.



Dr. Green is widely published in the field of internationalization. Among her recent publications are *Mapping Internationalization on U.S. Campuses* (2008), *On the Ground Overseas: U.S. Degree Programs and Branch Campuses Abroad* (2008), and *A Guide to Internationalization for Chief Academic Officers* (2008), *A Handbook for Advancing Comprehensive Internationalization: What Institutions Can Do and What Students Should Learn* (2006).

Over her 35-year career at ACE, Dr. Green has held a variety of positions in which she designed new initiatives and directed their implementation, conducted research, developed grant proposals, and served as facilitator and consultant to institutions worldwide. She served as director of the ACE Fellows Program, which prepares individuals for senior leadership positions (1978-1990), spearheaded a program of capacity building for South African universities (1992-2001), and more recently led a \$6.7 million USAID funded effort to strengthen South African further education colleges (2010). Among the many foundation-funded projects she has developed and led were a five-year effort on institutional change involving 26 U.S. institutions and a consortium of researchers; and Global Learning for All, a multi-institutional project to help participants devise comprehensive internationalization strategies (2004-08). She led ACE's efforts to develop international forums on a wide range of topics.

Dr. Green served as interim president of Mount Vernon College (Washington DC) from 1990-91. She is currently a board member at Juniata College (PA) and has also served on the boards of the International Association of Universities, Sweetbriar College (VA), Wilson College (PA), and the Forum on Study Abroad.

She was the recipient of the 2010 Charles Klasek Award of the Association of International Education Administrators (AIEA) for outstanding service to the field of international education.

Fluent in French and proficient in Spanish, Dr. Green holds a B.A. from Harvard University and a Ph.D. from Columbia University, both in French literature.
