



Sue Roberts is an economic and political geographer. Her research concerns the uneven development of the global economy and has focused on the rise of offshore financial centers, the regulation of global finance, gender and the global, the globalization of NGOs, neoliberal development practices, and the geopolitics of foreign aid. Sue has received research funding from the National Science Foundation and is co-editor of *An Unruly World?* and of *Thresholds in Feminist Geography*. She is author or co-author of papers in journals such as *Economic Geography*, *Antipode*, *World Development*, and *Geoforum*. A co-authored text, *Economic Geography: Places, Networks, and Flows*, is forthcoming. Sue's undergraduate degree is from the University of Leicester (UK) and she obtained her PhD in geography from the Maxwell School, Syracuse University. She has been on the faculty at the University of Kentucky since 1991 where she teaches in Geography and is associated with the Committee on Social theory and the Gender and Women's Studies Program. She has advised 7 PhD students to completion and currently advises 8 PhD students and one MA student.
