

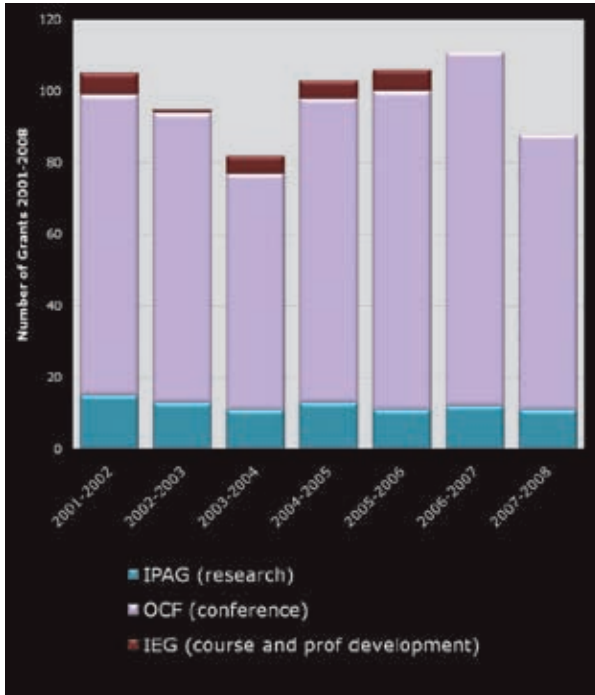
SUPPORT FOR ACTIVITIES OVERSEAS

Much of the international travel reported in the previous section was made possible by grants, either from outside sources or from IU.

For many years, the Office of the Vice President for International Affairs has supported competitive grants of various kinds that have made it possible for hundreds of IU graduate students and faculty members to pursue academic goals abroad. A smaller number of IU faculty and students have received support from outside the university, including grants from several agencies that represent the legacy of U.S. Senator J. William Fulbright.

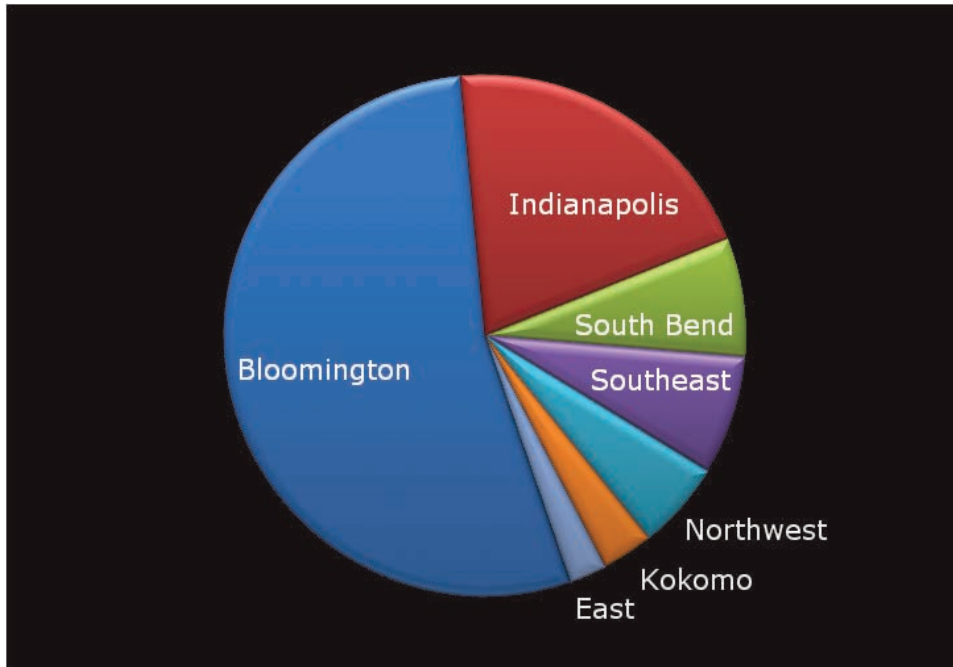


OVPIA FACULTY GRANTS – IU SYSTEM 2001-2008



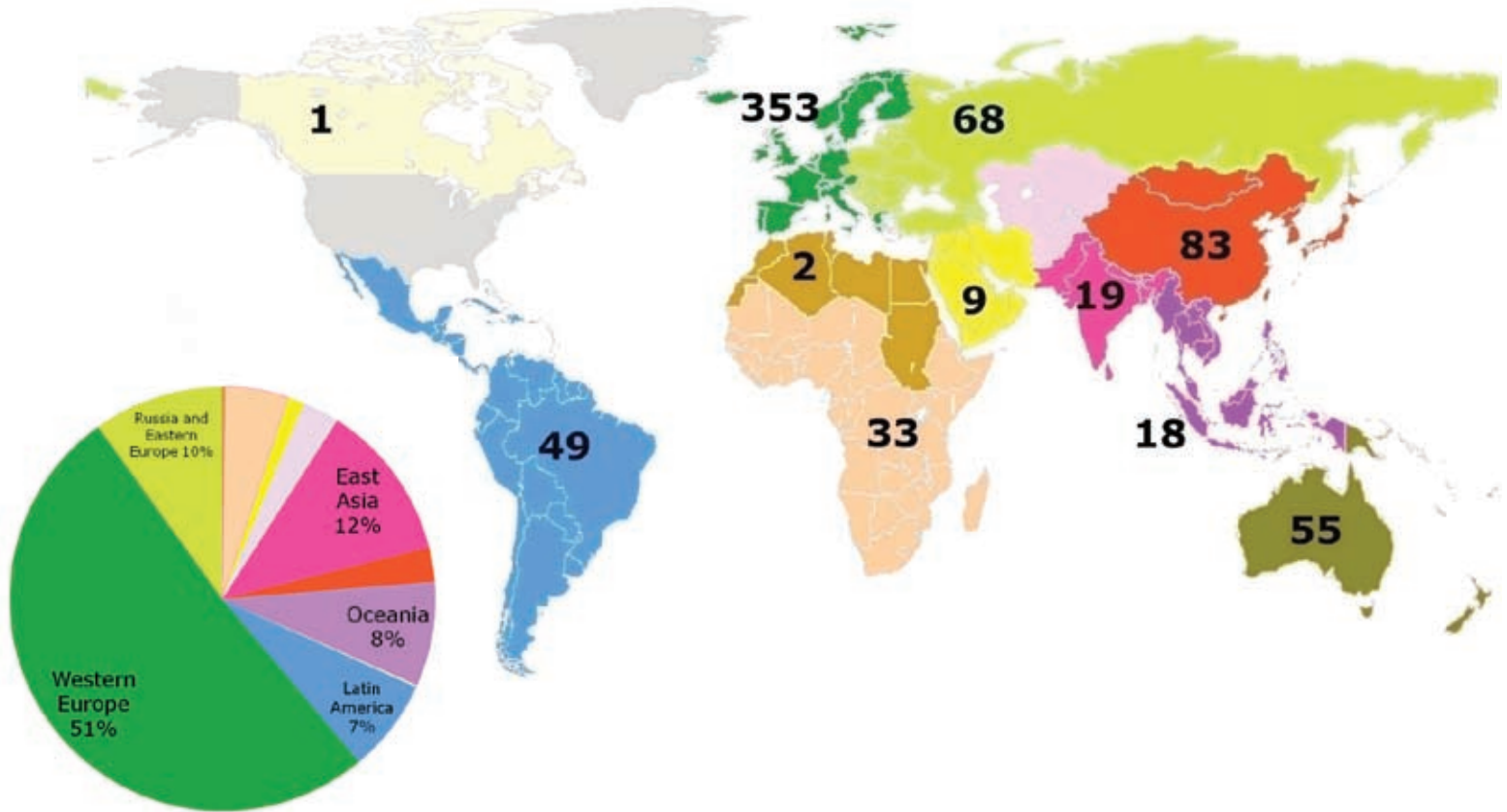
In the last seven years, OVPIA awarded 690 grants to faculty on IU system campuses. Grants were made in three categories. International Projects and Activities Grants (IPAG) support faculty research abroad. Overseas Conference Grants (OCG) subsidize faculty attendance at international conferences at which they present a paper. International Enhancement Grants (IEG) assist faculty in international professional and course development.

OVPIA FACULTY GRANTS – IU SYSTEM 2001-2007

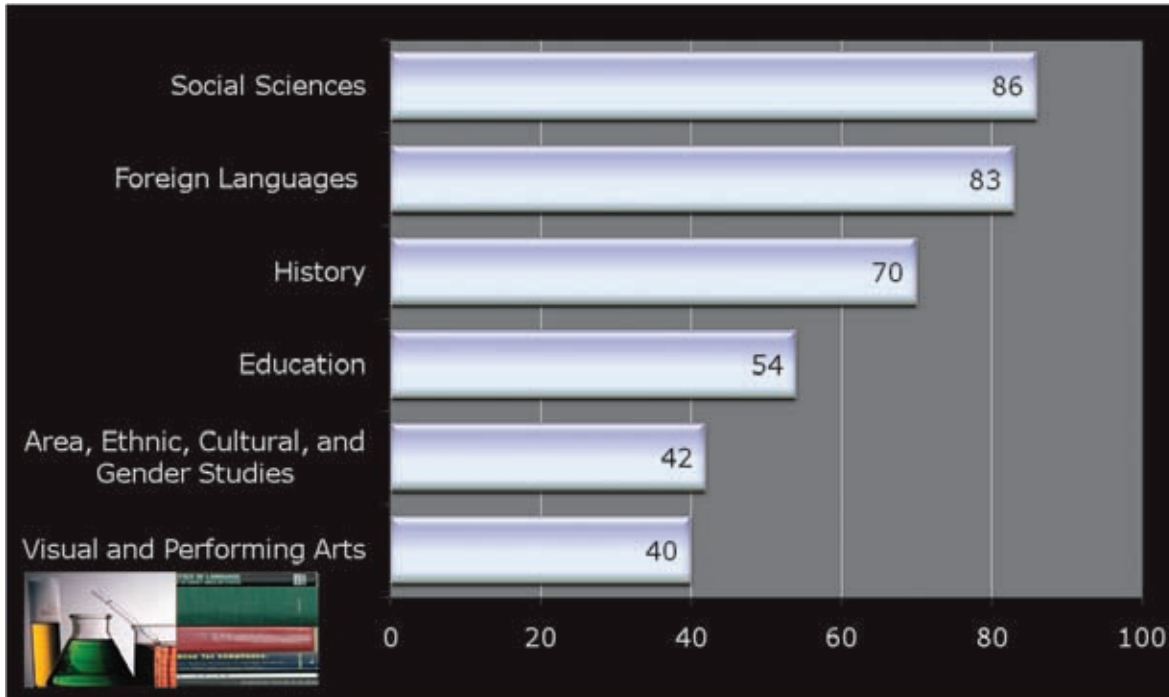

OVPIA FACULTY GRANTS – DESTINATIONS – IU SYSTEM 2001-2007



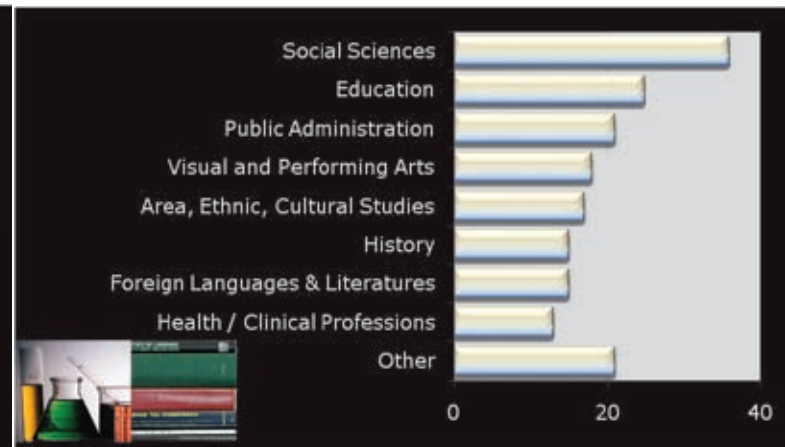
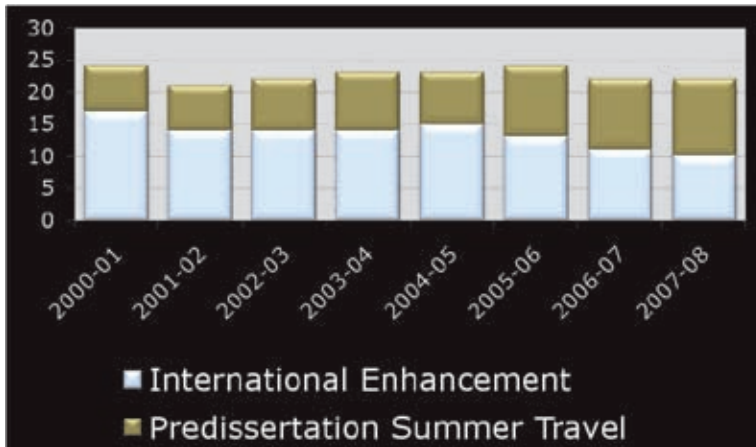
OVPIA FACULTY GRANTS TOP DISCIPLINES – IU SYSTEM 2001-2007



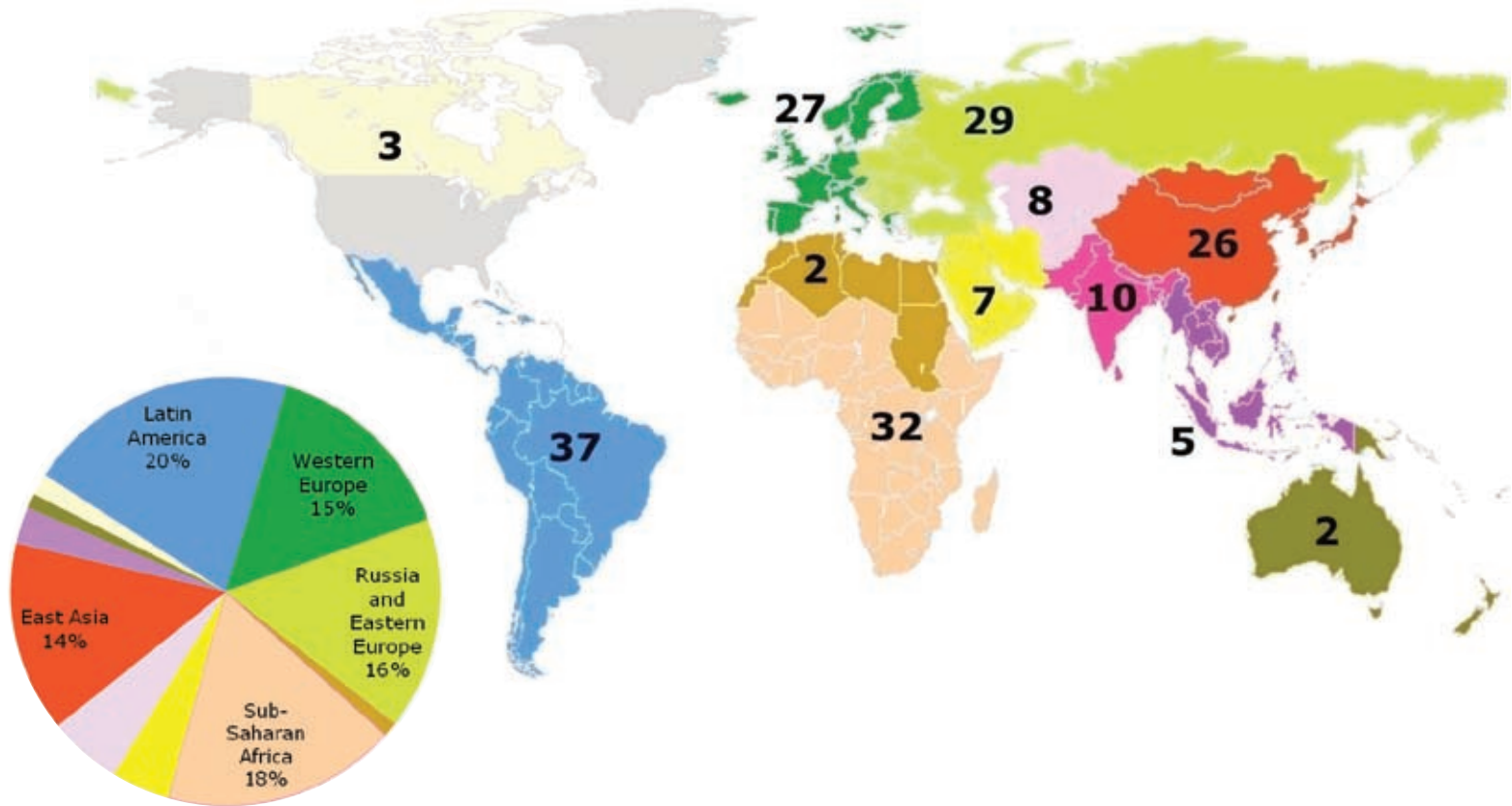
OVPIA GRADUATE STUDENT GRANTS – IU SYSTEM – 2001-2008

International Enhancement grants make it possible for graduate students to enhance an international component of their graduate degree program. Training activities supported include: enrollment in a foreign language or an area studies course not offered at IU; participation in a structured international internship or a formal training program or workshop on an international topic.

Predissertation Summer Travel grants support research-related summer travel abroad a full year prior to conducting dissertation research abroad. Activities supported include exploring potential research sites, archives, or other research resources; establishing institutional affiliations; identifying and meeting local scholars and contacts.



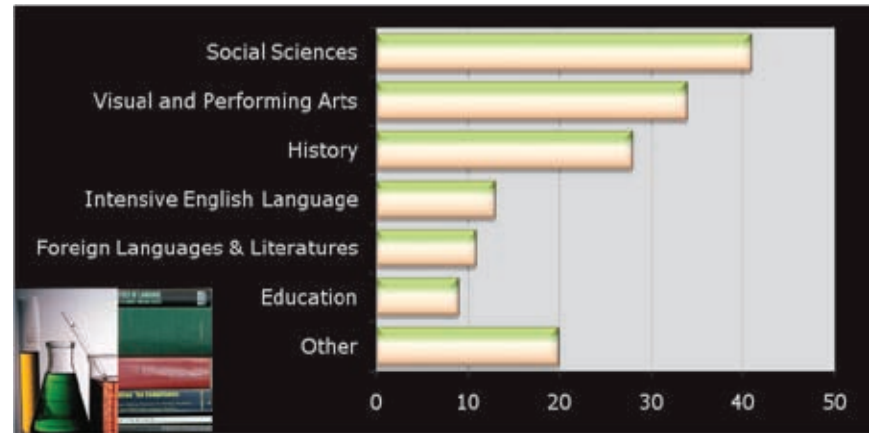
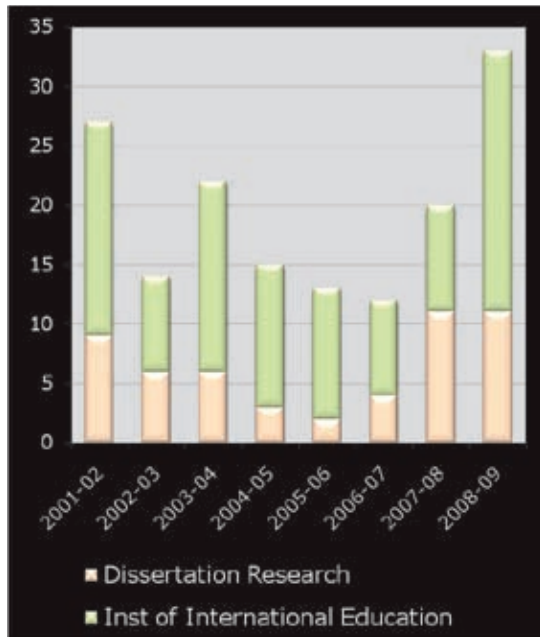

Dissertation Research grants are administered by the Fulbright-Hays unit of the U.S. Department of Education. They support doctoral dissertation research in non-Western European countries in modern foreign languages and area studies.

The **Institute of International Education** administers Fulbright grants that support graduate study or research abroad in any academic or professional field in participating countries.
