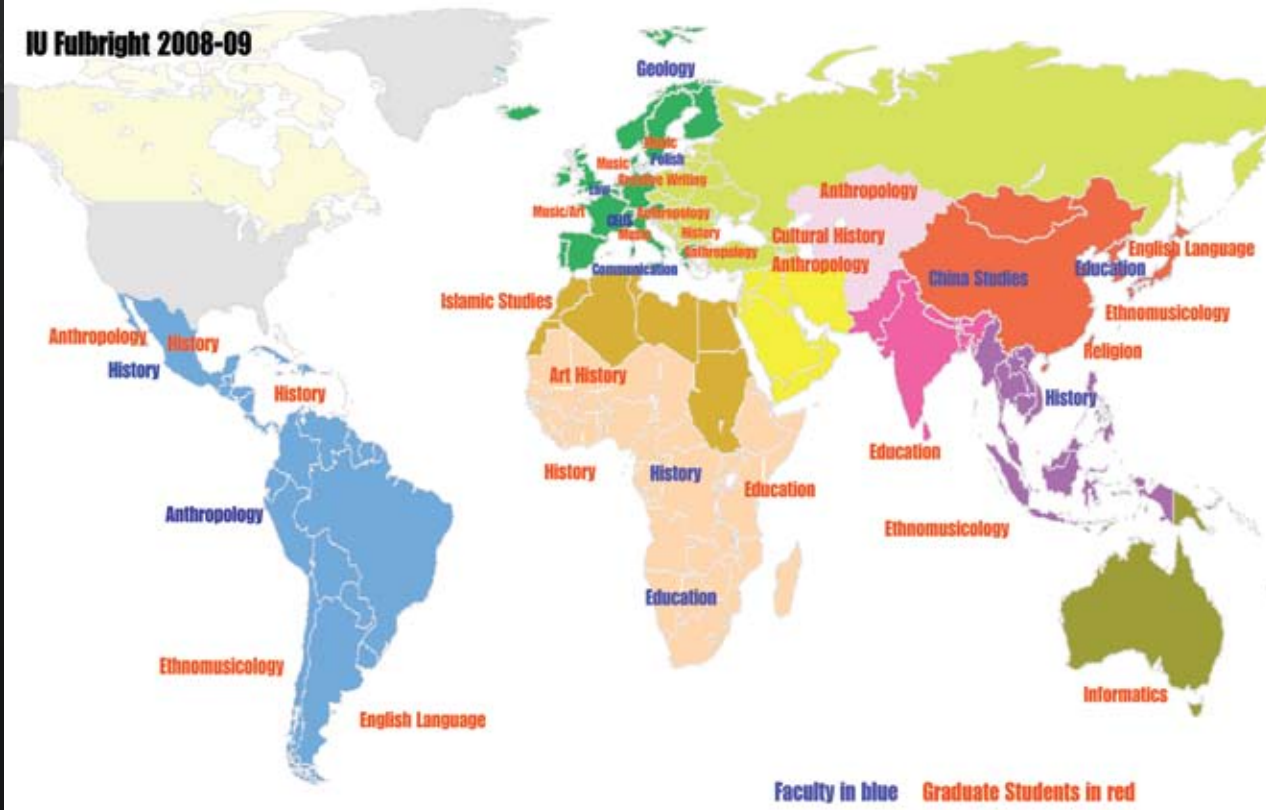

## Fulbright Sends IU around the World

The Fulbright program of fellowships was established in 1946 to honor William Fulbright, senator and international visionary. For well over half a century, the fellowships have extended the presence of U.S. scholars around the world and deepened our understanding of world issues. The program is really several programs, and last year those programs offered opportunities in record numbers to IU faculty and graduate students.

The Council for International Exchange of Scholars, a unit of the Institute for International Education, chooses top faculty members from around the United States. A very few of those scholars are honored for prestigious special programs. Two IU faculty members received Fulbright Distinguished Chair awards. Christopher Beckwith, IU professor of Central Eurasian studies, is teaching this year in a distinguished chair position at the University of Vienna. Gerald Nicholas Magliocca, professor of law at the IU School of Law—Indianapolis, holds a distinguished research chair at the Roosevelt Study Center in Middelburg, Netherlands.

Other faculty Fulbright scholars this year include five faculty members from

Bloomington, two each from Indianapolis and Fort Wayne, and one each from IU East and IU Southeast. Their work on four continents ranges from the geochemistry of carbon in the ground water of Norway to the dynamics of Chinese capitalism to effective AIDS/HIV counseling in Botswana.

Students receive awards from two agencies. The Department of Education offers fellowships for advanced dissertation research. Eleven of these awards were offered to IU students this year. The Institute for International Education selects recipients for more broadly based research, work that allows newer graduate students to explore possible research topics. A record 22 IU students were selected for these awards this year.

"A Fulbright grant is an exceptional opportunity for a student to gain invaluable experience abroad," says Patrick O'Meara, IU's vice president for international affairs. "I am delighted with the success and achievements of our students, and I look forward to ensuring that next year's applicants perform equally well."
