Van Kooten, who won the individual time trial last year with a time of 2:49:03 seconds, said ITTs are the first time teams get to check out their competitors.

"The results from ITTs really let you see who the contenders will be by race day because it is really a pure test of your strength and speed," Van Kooten said.

While Van Kooten has won ITT six times for both, many contenders are looking for last year's second and third

place Hildebrand — Caroline Brown of FI Beta, Phil and Brittany Stone of Delta Gamma — will be in the hunt for this year's title.

On the men's side, the system has placed in the top-10 of last year's event will be competing again this year.

The women's elite Young tops the list as the two-time defending champion with a time of 3:22 seconds.

"While the returning top-10 Hildebrand may have a mental edge based on previous success, Houghton said it is difficult for anyone to predict who will be at the end of the hour by the end of the day.

"In reality, there are about 30 riders that are competing for those top-10 spots," Houghton said. "Every year you find guys that come in more fit than you thought they'd be, so you never really know how everything will end up."

Although the individual trial times determine the seeding for Saturday's Mixed Time event, Houghton said teams do not alter their training for the time trials.

"Our team views this week as a stepping stone in our training in our ultimate goal of winning the title 100," Houghton said. "It's a good gauge to see where we are and where the other teams are at. That's the real, good teams train so they normally would through ITTs."
