## **UNIVERSITY WOMEN S CLUB PROGRAM**

Our Spring Luncheon will be at Chapmans on Thursday, April 11, at noon. The program will be Laura Shively doing a presentation on growing, using, and preserving herbs. Laura is a landscape designer and advanced master gardener. The menu will include a variety of herbs.

Laura Shively will be doing a presentation on growing, using and preserving herbs for the Spring luncheon. The menu will include a variety of dishes using the herbs discussed.

Laura and Joe Shively make their home in Nashville, Indiana, where they own and operate a retail nursery specializing in rare plants including unusual conifers, shrubs, perennials and herbs. Both Joe and Laura are stone carvers and offer their unique stone fountains, water basins, birdbaths and troughs for sale at their nursery. They will be moving their nursery to their home, and opening their private gardens this year. The Shively nursery, formerly Creative Gardens, will receive a new name this year called "Shively Plant Farm" Purveyors of Fine Plants. Laura is a landscape designer, Advanced Master Gardener, a member of the Brown County Purdue Extension Board holding the Agricultural position, a professional lecturer and also conducts a variety of hands-on workshops related to gardening. This year she became the new Indiana State Representative of the American Conifer Society. The American Conifer Society is an International Organization that encourages the development, conservation and propagation of conifers with emphasis on those that are dwarf and unusual.

The menu for the luncheon is a choice of ham and cheese quiche or spinach quiche both served with fresh fruit, salad greens containing fresh basil, herb butter, coffee, and tea. On the table will be bottles of vinaigrette and ranch dressing and there will be a wine cash bar. For dessert there is a chocolate terrine.
