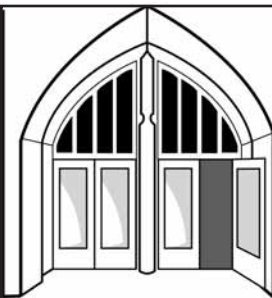

Our guest speaker, Julia Heiman will talk on "**Spotlighting the Kinsey Institute.**"

Julia R. Heiman, Ph.D., ABPP, is currently the Director of The Kinsey Institute for Research in Sex, Gender, and Reproduction and Professor of Psychology and Clinical Psychiatry at Indiana University. Previously she was Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the School in Medicine, University of Washington, where she was the Director of the Reproductive and Sexual Medicine Clinic and Associate Director for Psychotherapy Programs at the Outpatient Psychiatry Center. She earned her Ph.D. in clinical psychology, specialty psychophysiology, at the State University of New York at Stony Brook. She has held positions as a Research Scientist with the Long Island Research Institute as well as being a faculty member in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at SUNY Stony Brook.

Dr. Heiman has published broadly in the area of sex research on male and female sexual function and dysfunction, with her primary interests being psycho physiological components of sexual arousal patterns, sexual dysfunction treatment research, sexuality and health, and correlates of histories of childhood sexual and physical abuse. In 2001, she was honored as the Distinguished Scientific Achievement Award from the Society of the Scientific Study of Sex, as well as the Distinguished Psychologist by the Washington State Psychological Association.

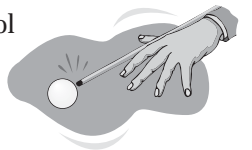
